

Yesterday, children in Early Years and Key Stage One took part in workshops with Big Foot Theatre company to round off our celebration of the month.

On Wednesday we had a visit from Reverend Marwood, Head Teacher of St. Mary's from 1988 to 2007. He has been back to visit us a few times since he retired from teaching and his visits are always fascinating as he retells stories of St. Mary's past. We are very grateful to him for gifting us a painting of the school as well as a complete back catalogue of past editions of St. Mary's News.

Our local authority school improvement advisor was in school this week and observed a KS2 Eucharist as well as teaching in Key Stage One. Future visits will focus on teaching in other phases/subjects. We received a very positive report which reflects the hard work that the whole community have put into making sure that this Autumn Term has been the most normal we have seen in a long time. There is a very purposeful and positive atmosphere in school and children are working really hard.

Many of you may have seen that, as with the Queen's funeral this year, an additional bank holiday has been added next year to mark King Charles's coronation. Therefore, school will be closed on Monday 8th May. This is the beginning of Key Stage Two SATs Week and we are awaiting further news from the Department for Education on how this will affect the testing week. It is thought that it may be delayed by a week. We will let you know when we have the correct information.
