

Mr Lett and I have had the pleasure of observing the teaching and learning of Science this week. We are due to continue to visit classes next week, but it has been really useful to measure the impact of the focused development work we are engaging in with STEM. In Year Two children were creating imaginary woodland creatures that were adapted to their habitat, year Three were testing the strength of magnets, Year Four and Five were studying the states of matter with Year Five predicting what would happen to raisins once they were placed in lemonade and Year Six were learning about the Linnaean Taxonomy and how it is used to classify living things. We saw lots of awe and wonder in the lessons we observed. We look forward to visiting the remaining classes to complete our observations.
