You can create your jellyfish at home or come and visit the exhibition at Southside Shopping Centre on Sat 22, Sun 23, Sat 29, Sun 30 April and Mon 1 May, (10am-5pm) to create your design.

Step 1

Draw a large jellyfish on the sheet of paper – use any colours and shapes you want! Be sure to include the three parts that you can see in the image below.

Step 2

Decorate your jellyfish using single-use plastics such as crisp packets, bread bags, bubble wrap, plastic carrier bags and other soft plastic items. Use only items that would otherwise be thrown away or recycled.

Think about experimenting with different patterns, textures and colours to make your jellyfish come alive.
