<u>PE Arrangements</u>
PE lessons continue to take place every Monday and Tuesday. Your child can
attend school on these days wearing the St. Mary's PE kit. If your child takes
part in a school sports club before or after school on a non -PE day, they are
required to change i.e. sports club before school then bring school uniform to
change into and after school bring PE kit to get changed into.

Maths will be set on Friday to be completed by the following <u>Wednesday</u> .
Over the weekend we would like the children to spend time looking at newspapers and listening or watching the news to develop their knowledge of
current affairs. They will be asked to present a report each weekend on a
topical news story that we will then reflect on and respond to on <u>Monday</u>
mornings. The children will also be set an open-ended Victorian project to
complete at their own pace over the term. This project is to be brought to
school on 10 th July.
Spellings will take on a different format this half term. Children will be tested
on key words Y6 children are expected to know by the end of Key Stage 2. A
spelling list has been sent home and 12 words will be randomly selected each week. The children will be tested on Friday and then if errors have been made,
they will have a catch up test on Monday.
